**USAGE PRECAUTIONS**

Avoid spilling, skin and eye contact. Keep away from heat, sparks and open flame. Ventilate well, avoid breathing vapours. Use approved respirator if air contamination is above accepted level. Container must be kept tightly closed. Use explosion proof electric equipment.

**STORAGE PRECAUTIONS**

Keep away from heat, sparks and open flame. Keep containers tightly closed. Keep in original container.

**STORAGE CLASS**

Flammable liquid storage.

**ENGINEERING MEASURES**

Provide adequate general and local exhaust ventilation.

**RESPIRATORY EQUIPMENT**

Respiratory protection must be used if air contamination exceeds acceptable level.

**HAND PROTECTION**

Use protective gloves.

**EYE PROTECTION**

Wear splash-proof eye goggles to prevent any possibility of eye contact.

**OTHER PROTECTION**

Wear appropriate clothing to prevent any possibility of liquid contact and repeated or prolonged vapour contact.

**HYGIENE MEASURES**

DO NOT SMOKE IN WORK AREA! Wash at the end of each work shift and before eating, smoking and using the toilet. Wash promptly with soap & water if skin becomes contaminated. Promptly remove any clothing that becomes contaminated. When using do not eat, drink or smoke.
